Saudi Aramco launches In-Kingdom Total Value Add program

Dammam — Designed to Increase Investment, economic diversification, job creation, and workforce development within the Kingdom, Saudi Aramco on Tuesday launched the In-Kingdom Total Value Add (KTVA) program.

The program will increase local content development of the supply chain in support of the company's growth and Kingdom economic diversification objectives. Its goal is to double the production of locally manufactured energy-related goods and services contracted by Saudi Aramco to 70%, as well as increase the exporting of Saudi-made energy goods and services to 30% by 2021.

Tuesday's faunch ceremony was held under the patronage of HRH Prince Saud bin Nayef bin Abdulariz, Governor of the Eastern Prov-Ince.

"IKTVA will create win-win, mutually beneficial partnerships between Saudi Aramco and our suppliers," said Amin Nasser, president and CEO. "The scale of our diversified energy business and associated capital expenditure programs clearly creates significant opportunities for those suppliers ready, willing, and able to invest in Saudi Arabia and partner with Saudi Aramco on a long-term, sustainable basis."

IKTVA will also prioritize workforce development and help create direct and indirect jobs for Saudis in energy-related sectors.











IKTVA Timeline


- The Company will ensure reliable, safe, and cost-effective worldwide supply chain capabilities to support uninterrupted operations.


